- 1. Join the AP Lit 24-25 and go to the summer work assignment. Copy the Major Works Data Sheet so that you have 2.
- 2. Complete the Major Works Data Sheet for *Of Mice and Men* by John Steinbeck. This is located on Google Classroom. My recommendation is to do this sooner rather than later, while the events of the book are still fresh. Bring your book back on the first day of school.

NOTE: If I wanted to read what the internet thinks of Steinbeck's work, I can Google it. I want YOUR work and words.

- Read Their Eyes Were Watching God by Zora Neale Hurston. I have copies of this novel if you need to check out one. Be ready for a short assessment on the contents of this novel on the first day of school; plan accordingly.
- Google the pdf for these short stories. Read them. For each one, write a one-half page reflection (about 250 words each), which includes your reactions and personal connections to plot, characters and writing style. DO NOT SUMMARIZE THE STORY
